Deco-Crete Color Hardener is a colored dry shake hardener that is broadcast by hand over the top of freshly placed concrete and worked in with a wood or resin float to form a dense, colored concrete "skin" on the slab surface. When used with Deco-Crete Antique Release, the ultimate textured surface can be achieved. The color hardened surface can also be stained after the concrete has cured for approximately 28 days. Sealing is highly recommended for all decorative concrete. For best results, use D-One, or Super Stamp Seal decorative concrete sealers for ultimate color enhancement.
